#### **#1 Compassion (Sympathy)**

The "Dearly Loved Person" will join you after you have acted out your part. This volunteer will then act out a way to give you the gift of <u>compassion</u> and clothe you with it by sticking that clothing card to you.

#### **#2 Kindness**

You have a broken right arm in a cast and you're trying to write with your right hand but it is very painful. So you try to write with your left hand but can't form your letters very well. You talk out loud about your frustration.

The "Dearly Loved Person" will join you after you have acted out your part. This volunteer will then act out a way to give you the gift of <u>kindness</u> and clothe you with it by sticking that clothing card to you.

#### **#3 Humility**

You are a basketball player dribbling the ball down the court toward your team's basket. With seven seconds left you shoot the ball and make the team-winning point.
