Warm-Up

(video segment 1:23 minutes/discussion time ____ minutes)

Discuss in your small group: Since last session, what have you done to deepen the spiritual atmosphere in your home? For example, did you have prayer or devotions with your spouse? What were the challenges you faced and what were the successes?



Legacy Point 1

The Evangelical Covenant Perspective

(video segment 11:56 minutes)

The Evangelical Church is a non-creedal church that is open to all Christians. Therefore, it is open to a variety of practices in regards to baptism. Parents have the option of either baptism or dedication for their infant.

1. Baptism: It is a sign or symbol of God's grace. The child is presented as part of a Christian family and also the family of God. Baptism symbolizes the parents' responsibility to raise the child in the church...to work, live and pray for the child's salvation. It also symbolizes the church's responsibility to support the parent(s) and child in growing up in the community of faith where the child will have every opportunity to choose faith as his/her way of living.
2. Infant Dedication: If a family chooses a believer's baptism for the child after he/she is old enough to make an informed commitment to Jesus Christ, they can have the infant dedicated. The parent(s) and church promise to raise the child in the faith and to live a Christian life in front of him/her. It is their responsibility to pray that this child will someday choose baptism for him/herself.

Both are a family experience where the child is presented to the Lord in the presence of the church that bless and pledge to give support to the family. This is an experience for the whole family of God.

Jesus commands us to baptize and make disciples:

In Matthew 28:19-20 he says, "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I will be with you to the end of the age."

The great commandment is to love God with all your heart, soul, and mind. The great commandment and great commission are central in the Evangelical Covenant Church. Therefore, an infant dedication is one of the greatest responsibilities and privileges of a parent...To declare in the presence of God and the church that this child belongs to Jesus Christ.

Matthew 18:3-5 says, "And he said: 'I tell you the truth, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore, whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. And whoever welcomes a little child like this in my name welcomes me.'"

God loves children and gives us the privilege to love them as well.

Luke 18:15-17 says, "People were also bringing babies to Jesus to have him touch them. When the disciples saw this, they rebuked them. But Jesus called the children to him and said, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. I tell you the truth, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.'"

Jesus touched and blessed little children! Infant baptism or dedication can also be the touch of God.

1 Corinthians 13:12-13, *“Now we see but a poor reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully even as I am fully known. And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.”*

Legacy Point 3

The Ceremony of Baptism/Infant Dedication

(video segment 9:09 minutes)

The baptism begins with a remembrance of Scripture about baptism. That is the command of Christ to make disciples and baptize. The baptism includes sprinkling or pouring of water over the child in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The infant dedication also begins with remembrance of Scripture...Jesus blessing the children. The child is held up before the Lord and dedicated to him.

In both ceremonies, parents promise before God and the church family to raise their child in the faith and to model the Christian faith before him/her. Sponsors also make these same promises.

In addition, the congregation promises to support the parents in raising the child in an environment of faith, hope and love.

Another option is for the parent(s) to also speak a blessing over the child at this ceremony. The Faith Chest is given as a symbol of investing in the treasure of that child's faith. Items of spiritual significance can be stored here.

Closing Prayer: *(Form small groups again and encourage each person to pray for the following.)*
Ask God to bless your family's spirituality and your role in leading it.

Assignment:

Plan a blessing event...a time to build your child's faith chest and meet together to celebrate this new beginning in your child's spiritual life.
