This Week's Lesson:

Miriam and Aaron Oppose Moses

Take Home Point:

(Parents Say) Moses led God's people.

(Kids Say) Obey God's leaders.

DRIVE TIME HOME

PARENTS, ASK ME WHAT I DID TODAY IN KINGDOM QUEST.

- Colored a picture by following the shepherd's directions, which reminds us of Jesus' providing leaders for us to follow.
- Put sprinkles on our graham cracker snack to remind us of Miriam's sickness of leprosy.
- Played a game of "Follow the Leader" to reinforce the teaching that we need to follow the leaders God has placed in our lives.

DRIVE TIME HOME

PARENTS, ASK ME WHAT I DID TODAY IN KIDS CHURCH.

- Tried on robes and headpieces to re-enact the Bible event.
- Made clouds and fire to indicate how God guided and led the Israelites.
- Played "Moses, May I?" to reinforce the take home point, *MOSES LED GOD'S PEOPLE – *Obey God's leaders.*

FAMILY DEVOTIONS: Read the Bible Event or Bible Verse

"Miriam and Aaron Oppose Moses" in an early reading Bible or read and summarize Numbers 12:1-16.

JESUS LINK: Jesus is a leader who we can follow: he gave his life for us.

TALK ABOUT IT:

- How did God correct Miriam and Aaron when they wanted to be boss instead of Moses?
- Who did God choose as his leader?
- Jesus also followed what God wanted him to do. What did Jesus do to earn us forgiveness and eternal life?

PRAYER POWER:

Ask God to help us obey and to serve him each day. Thank him for giving us leaders.

FAMILY TIME OPTIONS:

Go on a family outing through your city or town to identify people in leadership. Find and visit (if time permits) fire stations, schools, hospitals, police stations. Talk about why those working there may, on occasion, have authority or leadership. Discuss why leadership often shows love.
