This Week's Lesson:

Jesus Dies on the Cross

Take Home Point:

Jesus is my Savior...Jesus died and rose for me.

DRIVE TIME HOME: PARENTS, ASK ME WHAT I DID TODAY



- Puppet: Judy was sad her great-grandmother died, but happy to learn she will see her in heaven.
- Bible Event: We reviewed past lessons and learned about Jesus dying on the cross.
- Craft: We made a Sad/Happy Cross.
- Snack: We ate a graham cracker cross.
- Game: We played Cross Balance.
- We taught Albie the take home point.



- The traveler told us about Jesus' death.
- Finger painted with chocolate pudding on white paper.
- Bubba, the puppet, showed us sin and how Jesus forgives our sins.

FAMILY DEVOTIONS: Read the Bible Event from a children's Bible:

Jesus dies on the cross (Luke 23: 33, 44-56)

TALK ABOUT IT:

- Why was Jesus dying on the cross sad?
- Why was it happy?
- Whose sins did Jesus nail to the cross?

PRAYER POWER:

(Have child repeat after adult)

You sent your Son Jesus.
Jesus died and rose for me.
Thank you, thank you, thank you.
In Jesus' name.
Amen.
