This Week's Lesson:

King Hezekiah prays and God answers.

Take Home Point:

(Parents Say): God is our King.

(Kids Say): Pray to the King.

DRIVE TIME HOME

PARENTS, ASK ME WHAT I DID TODAY IN KINGDOM QUEST.

- Made a prayer pouch.
- Played a prayer game, using a paper bag.
- Made and ate folded jelly sandwiches.

DRIVE TIME HOME

PARENTS, ASK ME WHAT I DID TODAY IN KIDS CHURCH.

- Participated in a creative storytelling about King Hezekiah.
- Played a game with “prayer balloons”
- Made a watercolor craft as a reminder that God is our King – Pray to the King.

FAMILY DEVOTIONS: Read the Bible Event or Bible Verse

King Hezekiah prays and God answers from an early reading Bible or read and summarize the event from 2 Chronicles 32:1-22.

JESUS LINK:

We can pray to Jesus, too!

TALK ABOUT IT:

- What problem did King Hezekiah and his people have? How did they get help for their problem?
- What are some problems you have? How can you get help for your problems?
- Recall a time when God answered a family prayer.

PRAYER POWER:

Have each family member tell a problem they need prayers for. As each person shares a problem, have the rest of the family members put their hands on that person and pray for that person.

FAMILY TIME OPTIONS:

If you do not have a family prayer journal, start one now. Use a notebook to write down prayer needs. Younger children can tell their prayer requests to parents or older siblings, who will then write them down in the journal. Each evening, use the journal to help your family pray. Occasionally, go back through the journal and look for how God has answered the prayers.
