Lesson 49

Attention Grabber:

- blinder glasses—a pair of sunglasses that have been altered so that the wearer cannot see anything. This can be done with tape or paper. Option: sleep mask

The Power of the Cross:

- blinder glasses

Learning Game:

- pencils
- 10-12 index cards or 3" X 5" pieces of paper.

Bible Presentation:

- two blinder glasses
- three Bible period headpieces (Option: In lieu of one of the headpieces, a hooded sweatshirt will work.)

Attention Grabber:

- candy bar

Power of the Cross:

- candy bar

Learning Game:

Option one:

- stacking materials, such as cardboard boxes, milk jugs, plastic boxes, plastic pails, etc.

Option two:

- the game, Mad Gab, from www.Mattel.com or your nearest Wal-Mart or Toys R Us

Bible Presentation:

- flames cut from red, orange, and yellow construction paper or tissue paper

Application:

- your choice of a clip from either *Beyond the Gates of Splendor* that can be purchased from <http://www.foxstore.com/detail.html?item=1556> or rented from the local video store, or *The End of the Spear*, released as a movie January 2006

Lesson 51

Attention Grabber

- Mystery Box—a wrapped box with a removable top
- math book
- candy
- a cross

Power of the Cross

- two signs: one reads “Honor,” the other “Dishonor”

Application—Part One

- rubber dish gloves
- fuzzy winter gloves
- garden gloves
- puppet stage or dark curtain

Application—Part Two

- print and copy Appendix 3 (one per child)
- pencils
- assorted art supplies—markers, crayons, construction paper, glue, etc.

Lesson 52

Attention Grabber:

- several pieces of paper
- a container (bucket, hat, box, etc.) to put the paper in

The Power of the Cross:

- three index cards with a self-doubting phrase written on each one—examples are:
 - I'm not very important because I'm not an adult.
 - I'm not special. I don't sing in the worship team.
 - God couldn't use me.
- on the back of these cards write or place a label that says "From Satan"

Learning Game:

- one sock per twenty children
- masking tape
- the key verse (*Isaiah 43:1b*) printed on paper and placed in the sock

Bible Presentation: Video—use one of the following selections:

Application:

- a phone (pretend or real)

Lesson 53

Attention Grabber:

- three water glasses
- pitcher of water
- or three bottles of water

The Power of the Cross:

- bowl with about one cup of mud
- bowl of clean water
- a washcloth

Offering:

- offering basket
- disposable water bottle

Learning Game:

- large bucket or other container filled with water
- four smaller empty buckets

- variety of small containers to carry the water (bottle caps, spoons, thimbles, plastic syringe, plates, etc.)

Bible Presentation:

- two clear glasses or containers
- plastic dish with dirt
- a pitcher of water
- a block or stand for the container or glass of dirty water
- several pieces of dampened and twisted pieces of paper toweling
- spoon or stir stick

Application:

Option one

- items in *Bible Presentation* for water filtering demonstration

Option two

- a disposable bottle of water (one for each child)
- printed labels (one for each bottle); message on label reads: Line 1 “*Water—quenches thirst for a moment,*” Line 2 “*Living water—quenches thirst for a lifetime.*”

Lesson 54

Attention Grabber

- “Angry” page (see appendix)

Offering

- penny candy for each child
- optional bucket

Learning Game:

- one sleeping bag per team
- one bucket per team
- masking tape (to mark starting line)

Lesson 55

Attention Grabber:

- a pitcher that has about 10 ounces of water
- three 20-ounce fast food take-out cups with lids
- a thick sponge
- a large plastic sheet

Application:

- goofy hat or blazer
- toy snake
- artificial tree
- *optional*: head coverings for Adam, Eve, and Noah
- *optional*: masks or headband for a horse, a cow, and a sheep
- *optional*: socks for the animals' "hooves"

Learning Game

- a completed jumping Origami frog as described in the Appendix
- 8.5" X 8.5" sheets of green paper (one per child)
- pens

Lesson 56

Attention Grabber:

- two construction paper hearts cut out in exactly the same pattern. Tape or staple them around the edges, leaving the top open so that the hearts become a pouch open from the top.
- cut out pictures from a magazine of toys, food, and parents. If pictures are not available, simply print the words on separate pieces of paper.
- print out the verse: John 3:16 *"God loved the world this way: He gave his only Son so that everyone who believes in him will not die but will have eternal life."*
- confetti or other material that might remind us of praise stuffed in the heart pouch

Power of the Cross:

- words printed on separate pieces of paper: disobedience, selfishness, hate
- heart pouch from *Attention Grabber*

Offering:

- heart pouch from *Attention Grabber*

Learning Game:

- two buckets of clothespins—enough for three to five per student

Application:

Station One

- copies of the verse (Deuteronomy 6:4-5)and candies for rewards

Station Two

- two large strips of butcher paper taped together with these words on it: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength."
- markers, colored pencils, and crayons

Station Three

- Appendix A copied on cardstock and precut into slips of paper
- markers, colored pencils, and crayons for decorating
- tape or glue sticks for fastening

Station Four

- Appendix B copied on cardstock—fold in half to create a two-sided card
- markers, colored pencils, and crayons for decorating

Station Five

- Appendix C copied on cardstock
- markers, colored pencils, and crayons for decorating
- *Optional:* yarn and hole punch to create hanger

Lesson 57

Attention Grabber:

- tape (or other adhesive)
- crepe paper streamer cut into four equal pieces. Determine the size the paper needs to be cut by measuring from the ceiling to about five feet above the floor.

Power of the Cross:

- crepe paper streamer from *Attention Grabber*

Offering:

- play money (like Monopoly)

Learning Game:

Option one

- obstacle course using hula hoops or some other markers that are safe when kids step into them or bump against them
- two to five inflated balloons

Option two

- Skittles candies (three per kid)
- napkins

Bible Presentation:

- burlap sack with a hole cut in the top so that it can be worn by an adult leader
- paper rolled up to look like a scroll

Application:

- paper
- pencils

Lesson 58

Attention Grabber:

- rock painted gold, or some other object that reminds us of gold, such as a bag of rocks

Power of the Cross:

- rock painted gold, or some other object that reminds us of gold, such as a bag of rocks from *Attention Grabber*

Offering:

- pebble the size of a pea

Learning Game:

- inflated balloons (preferably gold)—one balloon for each team of six

Bible Presentation:

- *The Visual Bible: Acts* produced by the Visual Bible International. Show the clip of Acts 3:1-16. Order from http://www.christiancinema.com/catalog/product_info.php?products_id=364.

Application:

- three posters with headings reading “Your Story,” “My Story,” “His Story”
- a supply of gold coins
- Appendix with scenes to play





Appendix: Jumping Origami Frog


Fold the opposite edges together, and then unfold them. Repeat the process using the other edges. Open it up into a square again.




Fold each of the four corners to the center point.




Fold each of the two top edges to the centerline.




Fold the triangle at the bottom upwards.



Fold each of the bottom two corners to the middle of the bottom edge.



Fold the bottom portion upwards (along the dotted line).



Fold the top half of the lower rectangle downwards toward yourself. This forms the frog's legs.



Give your frog a head by folding a small part of the upper point downward. Draw two eyes, and your frog is done. To make your frog jump, push down on the "X" and slide your finger away from the frog.





One Minute Talk about God


Parents and child each talk about these questions for one minute.

Telling the Story

“I Have a Story To Tell”

Parents,

Today in Kids Church, we learned that we all have a story to tell. Through our stories, we can tell the story of Jesus. Your child was introduced to the following key phrases: *your* story, *my* story, and *his* story (or Jesus' story).

We learned from the Bible in 1 Peter 3:15 that in our hearts we *should* “*set apart Christ as Lord.*” We should always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks about the hope we have in our lives.

Before we give answers, we learn to listen. We listen to others' stories and find out the needs they have for Jesus. We listen to *Your* story.

After listening to others' stories, I can tell *My* story. My story is the experience I have in common with you. It might be something as simple as “I, too, have felt sad like that before.”

Then we can continue our story by telling *His* story—Jesus' story. For example, “Jesus helps me not feel sad because he promised me that he is with me always and I will live with him forever.”

On the back of this handout are several phrases that will help your children talk about situations: how they might listen to others (Your story), share their story (My story) and link it to God's help in Jesus (His story).
