1. Make it fit your church.

Simplify! Narrow it down. You are going to pick and choose from curriculum options to fit the personality of your ministry. Think, “What would our leaders like to do?” “What would our kids enjoy. It helps them learn when they are having fun learning and experiencing the lesson.

2. How to divide the children.

Group the children by older and younger. Some of the older and more responsible students might be well-suited to assist in teaching the younger. All the kids can be part of the Bible teaching and then go to a smaller group for their learning activity!

3. Look for special abilities with your leaders.

Some leaders are great Bible story tellers. Others could even do puppets. Some like crafts. Customize your lessons by choosing the things you your team will enjoy. Have fun with the learning experience. Make the lessons come alive as you can uniquely do!

4. Involve others from the congregation in gathering supplies.

What makes this curriculum interesting is the different supplies used in learning. But gathering these supplies can be a problem. How about using more people in church to have regular scavenger hunts to gather supplies? Small churches feel like family and it’s fun when everyone pitches in! Invite them to gather with you! Look ahead in your lessons several weeks and then share the list of supplies needed. Let people bring them.
